**Game Outlook:** After some late heroics by the Pointers in a 17-16 victory over the No. 2 ranked Warhawks of UW-Whitewater, the Pointers will need to keep their focus and their winning ways alive to keep pace in a tough WIAC race to the finish. The Pointers and Warhawks are separated by just a half game heading into the Nov. 1 weekend, and a win for the Pointers over UW-Oshkosh will help close the gap.

**Series History:** This is the 106th meeting between the Pointers and Titans. UWSP holds the all-time series lead, 56-41-8, dating back to 1896. Last season, the No. 22 ranked Pointers fell to the Titans at J.J. Keller Field, 27-10.

**Last Time Out:** Jared Jenkins hauled in a 10-yard pass from Jared Beckwith and then caught the two-point conversion attempt, again from Beckwith, with :15 remaining as the Pointers upset No. 2 ranked UW-Whitewater on Homecoming in Perkins Stadium, 17-16. The win by the Pointers snaps a 25-game conference winning streak and a 29-game home winning streak for Whitewater, dating back to Nov. 13, 2004.

**Radio:** The game can be heard live on WKQH (104.9 FM) and WWSP (89.9 FM) radio. Scott Krueger will call the the play-by-play and Ken Kulick providing the analysis on WKQH while UWSP students Scott Bembene and Micah Schroeder will have the call on WWSP. **NO AIR FORCE:** The Pointers boast the WIAC's best pass defense, allowing just 167.7 ypg. They will look to improve on that number Saturday as the Titans have the worst pass offense in the conference, averaging just 98.2 ypg.

**NOWHERE TO RUN:** Both teams have struggled in the ground game this season. The Pointers average just 83.9 ypg on the ground. The Titans haven't fared much better with a 94.2 ypg clip.

**PILL TAKE THAT:** The Pointers also lead the WIAC in turnover margin. The Pointers hold a +10 advantage in the turnover department, which is the 14th best differential in the nation. They have recovered 10 fumbles and recorded 11 interceptions, both league highs.

**PURPLE CURTAIN:** The Pointers total defense is ranked 10th in the nation, and they give up just 14 points per game. That's not good news for the Titans who are third to last in the nation in scoring, averaging just 8.33 points per game.

**RIVALRY RENEWED:** The game marks the 106th matchup in the rivalry between the Titans and the Pointers which is the longest rivalry in the WIAC, and the longest non-private school rivalry in NCAA Division III football.

**LONG DRIVE AHEAD:** Pointer punter Luke Frisch has backed up opposing teams deep into their own territory all season long. Frisch leads the WIAC in punting with a 39.76 average.

**SPLITTING THE UPRIGHTS:** The Pointers have also received outstanding special teams play from WIAC Special Teams Player of the Week Ryan Graboski. Graboski is 2nd in the nation averaging 1.86 field goals per game, and is 13 for 18 on field goal attempts this season.

**GO TWO GUYS:** WR Jared Jenkins and TE Brad Kalsow have emerged as QB Jared Beckwith's favorite targets. Kalsow has 45 receptions for 532 yards, while Jenkins has grabbed 44 balls for 424 yards, including 69 receiving on the Pointers game winning drive against UW-Whitewater.

## Pointers Hold Off Webber For Spud Bowl Victory

STEVENS POINT – Webber International outgained the Pointers 253 to 177 on Saturday afternoon, but a solid defensive effort in the game's final minutes allowed the Pointers to hold off the Warriors, opening the 2008 season with a 23-21 win.

The UWSP defense came out strong in the game's opening drive, forcing a 3 play negative 11 yard drive that resulted in a Warrior punt. The Pointers then posted a seven play, 30 yard drive, highlighted by a Jared Beckwith (Baraboo) pass completion to Aaron Leonhardt (Baraboo) that put UWSP in range of Ryan Graboski (Woodbury, Minn.), who put the Pointers up 3-0 on a 33-yard field goal.

Grabowski added another field goal, this time from 36 yards out, after UWSP's Brian Bailey (New Lisbon) recovered a Webber fumble forced by Brad Vickroy (Wis. Rapids/Lincoln), putting the Pointers on top 6-0.

In the second half, Webber pieced together a 10 play, 97 yard drive to take a 7-6 lead with 2:20 left in the third quarter, their only lead of the game. On the play, Webber quarterback Daniel Lafleur (Stuart, Fla.) found Taylor Atwood (Davie, Fla.) for a 39-yard completion down the left sideline to paydirt.

The Pointers answered back an eight play, 31 yard drive that put Grabowski in range for a 26 yard field goal as UWSP regained the lead, one they did not relinquish.

The Pointers added seven more points just two plays later as Stremkowski recovered a Lafleur fumble and T.C. Farber picked up 22 of his 42 yards on the day on the Pointers first play, going around the right side and finding the end zone for a quick six points.

Webber again capitalized on a UWSP turnover two drives later, as Lafleur found Sergio Rivera for a 19 yard touchdown with 3:03 remaining, cutting the lead to just two, 23-21. This time, the two-point conversion was good, cutting UWSP's lead to 23-21.

After a three-and-out by the Pointers, the defense again stepped up, as Bryan Blum (Baraboo) intercepted Lafleur, sealing the victory for the Pointers.

For the Pointers, Beckwith finished the day going 18-for-30 for 154 yards and no touchdowns. Farber had 15 carries for 42 yards and one touchdown. Graboski was 3-for-4 on field goals, connecting from 33, 36 and 26 yards out. Brad Kalsow (Huntley, Ill.) was the Pointers leading receiver on the day, snagging seven balls for 77 yards.

On defense, Tyler Florczak (Chetek) led the day for the Pointer defense, registering 11 tackles, four solo. Stremkowski added 10 and Charlie Dercks (Little Chute) had nine, including two tackles for a loss of seven yards.

## Pointers Roll Iowa Wesleyan 45-7

STEVENS POINT – The UW-Stevens Point football team wasted no time in shaking off last week's slow offensive start on Saturday, as they racked up 329 yards of total offense, defeating Iowa Wesleyan 45-7 in a rain-soaked affair at Community Stadium at Goerke Park.

The Pointers got on the board early, taking the opening kickoff and driving down the field in a six play, 62 yard scoring drive that culminated in Jared Beckwith (Baraboo) finding Brad Kalsow (Huntley, Ill.) for a 10 yard touchdown strike. Ryan Graboski's (Woodbury, Minn.) kick made the game 7-0 just over two minutes into the contest.

Just two plays into Iowa Wesleyan's first drive, the Tigers coughed up the ball and UWSP's Charlie Dercks (Little Chute) pounced on the ball, giving the Pointers the ball back inside the visitor's 20. Just five plays later, C.L. Whiteside (Milwaukee) got the call and punched the ball across the goal line, giving the Pointers a 13-0 advantage with 10:38 remaining in the opening quarter. Graboski's kick made the score 14-0.

From there, the Iowa Wesleyan defense forced two three-and-out possessions by the Pointers until another fumble by the Tigers gave the Pointers the ball deep in Iowa Wesleyan territory. The Pointers drove to the visitor's four yard line, but the Tiger defense kept UWSP out of the end zone, forcing a 21 yard Grabowski field goal attempt. The kick floated wide right, and the Pointers were unable to convert on the Tiger fumble.

In the second half, it was again all Pointer offense, as Graboski added a 41-yard field goal on the Pointer's first possession of the second half after forcing another three-and-out by the Tiger offense, 38-0. Iowa Wesleyan then strung together a nine play, 55 yard drive that took 4:53 and got as close as the Pointer 20, when on fourth and four, Fisch intercepted Abihider's pass, giving the Pointers the ball on their own nine.

The lone Pointer turnover of the day came at the end of the third quarter, as a Beckwith pass was intercepted by Gerald Knighten (Bellwood, Ill.) and returned 13 yards to the Pointer 25. Greg Fields (St. Louis, Mo.) put the Tigers on the board at the start of the fourth quarter, breaking away for a 19 yard touchdown run and a Scott Knipfer (Cottage Grove, Wis.) made the score 38-7.

Point answered with a score of their own, stringing together a nine play 68 yard touchdown drive that ended with Beckwith finding Jake Swank (Oregon) on a four-yard touchdown pass, putting the Pointers on top 45-7.

## Late Heroics Lead Pointers Past Azusa

STEVENS POINT – Jared Beckwith (Baraboo) connected with Brad Kalsow (Huntley, Ill.) for a 14 yard touchdown pass with 3:24 remaining in the game, and Ryan Graboski's (Woodbury, Minn.) point after gave the Pointers the 10-9 victory over the visiting Cougars of Azusa Pacific on Saturday afternoon.

After a John Jones (Oregon) interception on the ensuing Azusa possession, the Pointers had another opportunity to score, but Beckwith's rush with time running down came up just short, as Azusa's Shea Struiksma (Artesia, Calif.) made the tackle on the quarterback keeper, keeping the score a 3-0 advantage for the Pointers heading into the locker room.

Azusa's Corey Lenahan (La Mirada, Calif.) tied the game at 3-3 with 2:40 remaining in the third quarter, knocking home a 36 yard kick, capping an 11 play, 55 yard drive for the Cougars.

After a missed 35 yard kick by Graboski to open the fourth quarter, Azusa drove down the field on a 13 play, 73 yard drive that ended in Lenahan connecting on another field goal, this time from 24 yards out, giving Azusa the 6-3 advantage.

On the ensuing kickoff, Azusa capitalized on a Pointer miscue, falling on the ball in Pointer territory, getting the ball back at the Pointer 23 yard line. After two rushes for a loss of four yards, thanks to two huge tackles from Brian Bailey (New Lisbon), Lenahan put a 44 yard kick between the uprights, giving the Cougars a 9-3 advantage with just over five minutes remaining in the game.

After a Jack Marx (Scandinavia) 23 yard kick return put the Pointers in Azusa territory, Beckwith found Kalsow for completions of three, two and 17 yards to give the Pointers a first and 10 on the Azusa 14 yard line when Beckwith found Kalsow for the tying score. Graboski's kick was good, and the Pointers went ahead 10-9.

With :53 remaining and Azusa driving, Tyler Florczak (Chetek) sealed the game with an interception, his second of the game, to give the Pointers the ball, and the win, 10-9.

## Offensive Explosion not enough as Falcons down Pointers 36-30

RIVER FALLS - UW-Stevens Point had their best day through the air so far this season, passing for 234 yards and two touchdowns, but the Pointer offense managed just 70 yards on the ground and the defense allowed 610 all-purpose yards as the Falcons of UW-River Falls handed the Pointers their first loss of the season, 36-30, in the WIAC opener for both teams.

Down 6-0 after a Falcon touchdown and failed extra point, Ryan Graboski (Woodbury, Minn.) capped a nine play, 34 yard drive for the Pointers with a 24 yard field goal, putting the Pointers on the board 6-3.

Falcons' kick returner Greg Klingelutz then returned the ensuing kickoff 86 yards for a touchdown, answering right back, and after a blocked extra point, the Falcons held a 12-3 lead.

Graboski added a 25 yard field goal and Charlie Dercks (Chetek) fell on a fumble in the Falcon's end zone, as the Pointers took their only lead of the day, 13-12 with 12:50 remaining in the second quarter.

The Falcons tacked on another touchdown, this time a 17 yard touchdown pass to Michael Zweifel, to take the 20-13 lead seven minutes later. The Pointers answered, knotting the score at 20 when Jared Jenkins (Milwaukee) hauled in his first touchdown of 2008, a five yard pass from Beckwith with 2:30 remaining in the first half, to again tie the score at 20.

With time running out in the first half, the Falcons capitalized on a Jared Beckwith (Baraboo) interception, deep in Pointer territory, to tack on an extra touchdown before the half as Storm Harmon connected with Patrick Houlton on two straight 19 yard passes, the second good for six points and a 27-20 Falcon advantage.

In the second half, neither team's offense, after cruising up and down the field in the first half, could put much together, as the Pointers tacked on a 32 yard Graboski field goal to cut the deficit to four, 27-23, but Zweifel struck again for the Falcons, hauling in an 18 yard pass from Harmon, pushing the lead to 34-23 heading into the fourth quarter.

After a safety pushed the score to 36-23, the Pointers capitalized on a Falcon miscue, getting the ball back at the 11 yard line, and with time winding down, Beckwith found Jenkins for his second score of the day, cutting the deficit to six with 4:49 remaining.

The Falcons then strung together a seven play, 30 yard drive together that ate 2:42 away from the clock, and with the Pointers pressing in the game's final minutes, forced a Beckwith interception that sealed the victory for River Falls.

All day, neither team was able to string together a drive longer than nine plays, as both defenses put the clamps on the running and passing games of their opponent.

A week after the Pointers gave up 610 total yards to River Falls, the team rebounded, allowing the Pioneers to gain just 47 yards on 34 carries and held the visitors to 137 yards through the air. Tyler Florczak (Chetek) led the Pointers on the day with 11 total tackles, while Charlie Dercks (Little Chute) tallied seven tackles, including two for a loss of 14 yards, a sack and two quarterback hurries. John Jones (Oregon) also added nine tackles in the win.

Offensively, the Pointers gained 305 yards on 67 plays, 192 of those yards through the air. Jared Beckwith (Baraboo) completed 22 of 31 passes and was sacked only once, but also threw three interceptions. Jared Jenkins (Milwaukee) tallied six catches for 51 yards while Brad Kalsow (Huntley, Ill.) recorded five catches for 56 yards. Mike Ferron (Racine) finished as the leading rusher for the Pointers, gaining 58 yards on 12 carries, including a long of 28, for a 4.8 per carry average.

This was the second time in eight days a UW-Stevens Point team coached by a member of the Miech family has shutout Platteville, as the women's soccer team collected a 6-0 victory over the Pioneers on Oct. 4.

## Pointer Defense Spoils UW-Stout's Homecoming

MENOMONIE - The UW-Stevens Point defense held UW-Stout to just 26 yards rushing and added a safety as the Pointers defeated the Blue Devils 19-9 in Wisconsin Intercollegiate Athletic Conference action Saturday at Williams Stadium in Menomonie.

In a game which saw both teams combine for 27 penalties totaling 254 yards, the Pointer defense shined through and the offense provided enough big plays to give UWSP its fifth consecutive win over UW-Stout.

The Pointer defense forced the Blue Devils to punt in each of their first five possessions, and only allowed Stout's offense to put points on the board one time in the contest.

## Pointers Upset No. 2 UW-Whitewater

WHITEWATER - Jared Jenkins (Milwaukee) hauled in a 10-yard pass from Jared Beckwith (Baraboo) and then caught the two-point conversion attempt, again from Beckwith, with :15 remaining as the Pointers upset No. 2 ranked UW-Whitewater on Homecoming in Perkins Stadium, 17-16.

The win by the Pointers snaps a 25-game conference winning streak and a 29-game home winning streak for Whitewater, dating back to Nov. 13, 2004.

Whitewater scored first, off a 33-yard touchdown reception by Aaron Rusch but UWSP senior Bryan Blum (Baraboo) got a hand on the extra point, keeping the Warhawk advantage to 6-0 with 13:02 left in the opening quarter.

Stevens Point answered when Ryan Graboski (Woodbury, MN) capped a 10 play, 56-yard drive with a 20-yard field goal, getting the Pointers on the board and cutting the deficit to three, 6-3.

The third quarter was a defensive struggle, as neither team could muster up any offense. Whitewater threatened when they drove down to the Pointer 30-yard, but came away empty-handed when Jeff Schebler's field goal sailed wide left.

On the ensuing possession, the Warhawks took advantage of three Stevens Point penalties setting up a first-and-goal at the Pointer 7-yard line. The Pointer defense held tight, forcing Whitewater to settle for a field goal which gave the Warhawks a 16-9 lead with just 4:49 remaining in the game.

Point got the ball back at their own 16-yard line needing to score a touchdown with just 1:33 remaining on the clock. That's when things got exciting at Perkins Stadium.

After an incompletion, Beckwith hit Jenkins on a 12-yard pass. Then after a couple of incompletions and a Whitewater offside penalty, Beckwith hit Jenkins again on a 19-yard pass for another Point first down.

On the next series, Beckwith scrambled for ten yards to give the Pointers a first down at the UWW 38. Beckwith then went back to the well, hitting Jenkins for two 14-yard completions to give the Pointers a first-and-goal at the UWW 10-yard line with :20 remaining.

The Pointers capped off a 15 play, 79 yard drive against one of the nation's top defenses when Beckwith found Jenkins again on a 10-yard pass for a Pointer touchdown to make the score 16-15.

The Pointers decided to go for the win by attempting a two-point conversion. After a couple of timeouts, Beckwith once again found Jenkins for the conversion to give the Pointers a 17-16 lead with just :15 showing on the clock.
