Head Coach Bob Semling:

Bob Semling owns a 43-13 career record in his third season as the Pointers' head coach. Semling spent the previous two years as the top assistant with UW-Stevens Point's NCAA Division III championship squads. Semling also coached seven seasons with the Pointers under Bob Parker from 1988-95 before coaching six seasons at UW-Green Bay and one year at New Mexico.

Pointers Update:

UW-Stevens Point returns four starters from last year's Sweet 16 squad. The four returning starters contributed just less than 60% of the team's points last year. Leading the returnees will be junior forward Pete Rortvedt and senior guard Steve Hicklin. Both were first team All-WIAC selections last season. Rortvedt led the conference in scoring in 2006-07, averaging 16.9 points per game. He also led the league in three-pointers made with 95. Hicklin was the next closest player with 74 three-point field goals. Hicklin shot 50% from beyond the arc last season, second best in NCAA Division III.

Other starters returning include junior forward Bryan Beamish and junior guard Khalifa El-Amin. Beamish was an honorable mention all-conference player in 2006-07. Beamish averaged 9.7 points and just fewer than four rebounds per contest. El-Amin led the conference with 127 assists last season. His assist-to-turnover ratio also led the WIAC at 3.26.

Team Notes:

- * The Pointers have won 12 straight home openers since a loss to Valley State (ND) to open the 1994-95 season. In fact, the Pointers haven't been under .500 at any point since losing their season opener to Teikyo Marycrest in 1995-96. However, they rallied to finish that season with a 17-8 record.
- * The 18-point victory over Carroll last season was the Pointers biggest against a ranked foe since the 24-point national title game win over Rochester (NY) in 2005.
- * UW-Stevens Point went 26-3 last season, which was the sixth time the Pointers have won 26 games in a season. The Pointers were 26-4 in 1982-83, 28-3 in 1983-84, 27-2 in 1990-91, 29-5 in 2003-04, and 29-3 in 2004-05.
- * Including the postseason, the Pointers are 70-7 in their last 77 games against non-WIAC opponents, dating to January 2000. Four of the seven losses came in 2005-06.
- * UW-Stevens Point has won 23 straight games against Midwest Conference opponents dating to a 68-51 loss at Ripon in 1976-77. Since then, the Pointers have beaten St. Norbert eight times, Lawrence six times, Carroll five times and Ripon four times.
- * The Pointers led all NCAA Divisions last season in free throw percentage and fewest turnovers.
- * The Pointers have made at least seven three pointers in 27 straight games. Stevens Point has made at least seven three-pointers in 49 of the 56 games under Coach Bob Semling.

Individual Notes:

- * Junior forward **Pete Rortvedt** (Minocqua, WI) made a school record 95 three-point field goals last season. He led the WIAC in scoring averaging 16.9 points per game. He is a second team preseason All-American according to D3hoops.com.
- * Senior guard **Steve Hicklin** (Sussex/Hamilton) was a first team All-WIAC selection last season. Hicklin shot 50% from beyond the arc last season, which was second best in Division III
- * Junior guard **Khalifa El-Amin** (Milwaukee/Rufus King) led the WIAC with 127 assists and also led the conference with a 3.26 assist-to-turnover ratio last season.
- * Freshman guard **Jared Jenkins** (Milwaukee/Rufus King) played football this fall for head coach John Miech. Jenkins led the Pointers with 43 receptions. He also scored four touchdowns.

Scouting the Opponent

The Carroll College men's basketball team enters the 2007-2008 season after its most successful season in history. The Pioneers won their first Midwest Conference Tournament and advanced all the way to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament a year ago.

The Pioneers lost three of their top four scorers, however, and return just two players who averaged in double-figures last season. Junior Wes Ladwig averaged 10.7 points per game from his point guard position and senior Ryan Mueller scored 11.1 points per game while coming off the bench in 20 of the team's 27 games.

Seniors Jeremy Bohn and Keith Johnson, junior Nathan Zimmerman and sophomore John Hoch also return after seeing significant court time a year ago. Bohn, Johnson and Zimmerman will give the Pioneers experience on the low blocks while Hoch will provide speed in the backcourt.

Sophomores Jamaul Johnson and Eric Thompson are expected to give the Pioneers quality and experience off the bench.
