#### **Head Coach Bob Semling:**

Bob Semling owns a 65-19 career record in his third season as the Pointers' head coach. Semling spent the previous two years as the top assistant with UW-Stevens Point's NCAA Division III championship squads. Semling also coached seven seasons with the Pointers under Bob Parker from 1988-95 before coaching six seasons at UW-Green Bay and one year at New Mexico.

#### **Pointers Update:**

The ninth-ranked UW-Stevens Point men's basketball team received an atlarge selection to the NCAA Tournament, making it its fifth appearance in the last six years.

The Pointers had to get the at-large selection after falling to UW-Whitewater 75-71 in the WIAC Tournament Championship game. The Pointers trailed by as much as 14 in the second half but rallied back to cut it to one with under 20 second left. Stevens Point then had a chance to tie the game with a three-pointer with under 10 seconds left, but the shot was short and the Warhawks hung on.

It was the first WIAC Tournament title game loss for the Pointers, falling to 4-1. **Steve Hicklin** led the Pointers with 20 points. **Khalifa El-Amin** had 15 points and **Louis Hurd** added 10 points.

#### **Team Notes:**

- \* UW-Stevens Point is making its seventh NCAA Tournament appearance. The Pointers have reached the Elite Eight in four of the previous six appearances.
- \* UW-Stevens Point has won 22 of its last 25 postseason contests. Over the past eight seasons, the Pointers are 74-15 during the months of February and March.
- \* The Pointers have won 12 of their last 13 NCAA Tournament games and own the best record of any team in NCAA Division III Tournament history with a 17-4 all-time record.
- \* The Pointers are 80-9 in their last 89 games against non-WIAC opponents dating to January 2000.
- \* The Pointers are 3-2 against teams in the NCAA Tournament this year. Stevens Point went 1-2 against UW-Whitewater and defeated both Lawrence University and Augustana College.
- \* UW-Stevens Point along with the University of Chicago and the University of St. Thomas are three of 12 institutions that have both the men and the women in the NCAA Tournament. All three teams are in the same pod for both tournaments.
- \* In the 10 years of the D3hoops.com top 25 poll, UW-Stevens Point men's and women's teams have collected the second-most votes combined. Washington (Mo.) is in first. The Pointers men's team has collected 51,627 votes in the 10 years.
- \* The Pointers are ranked first in NCAA Division III with a 1.54 assist-to-turnover ratio. They are third in the country, averaging just 10.2 turnovers per game.
- $\ast$  The Pointers are sixth in the nation with a .509 field goal percentage. They rank eighth with a + 14.3 scoring margin.
- \* UW-Stevens Point went to the free throw line just six times on Saturday against UW-Whitewater. The Pointers are 2-3 in games, where they go to the free throw line less than 10 times.
- \* The Pointers are second in the WIAC in scoring offense (77.5) and lead the league in scoring defense (63.2). The Pointers are 1-3 when they score under 70 points this season.
- \* UW-Stevens Point leads the WIAC in blocks (92), steals (217), and assists (440). The Pointers have a + 4.25 scoring margin.
- \* The Pointers lead the WIAC with 232 three-point field goals.

#### **Scouting the Opponent**

The University of Chicago is making its second straight appearance in the NCAA Division III Tournament and its fourth in the last nine years. The Maroons received the automatic bid to the tournament after winning the University Athletic Association (UAA) regular season championship. Chicago defeated Washington (Mo.) Saturday 74-66 to capture the crown.

The Maroons have won six straight games and seven of the last eight entering tourney play. Chicago is 4-2 against teams in the NCAA Tournament this season as they swept Brandeis and split against both Rochester and Washington (Mo.).

Chicago is ranked third in the nation with a 1.45 assist-to-turnover ratio. The Maroons are the ninth most prolific three-point shooting team in the country, making 10 three-pointers per game.

The Maroons are led by senior forward Nate Hainje, who is averaging 15.9 points and 7.3 rebounds per game. Hainje is the only player in the UAA to average in the top ten in scoring, rebounding, and assists. He has seven double-doubles this season. He has been named UAA Player of the Week the past three weeks. The leading scorer for Chicago is junior guard Matt Corning, who averages 18.1 points per game. Corning has scored in double-figures in 11 straight games.

Buena Vista College is making its eighth appearance in the NCAA Tournament and its sixth in the last seven years. The Beavers received one of the 21 at-large births to get into the tourney. Buena Vista was Iowa Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (IIAC) regular season champions, but fell to Loras College 77-69 in the IIAC Tournament Championship game. The Beavers are 2-1 against teams in the NCAA Tourney.

As a team, Buena Vista averages 76.6 points per game and shoots 47 percent from the field. It also shoots 39 percent from behind the 3-point line and 68 percent from the free-throw line. The Beavers are 28th in NCAA Division III, out-rebounding opponents by over six boards per game.

The Beavers are led offensively by junior guard Andre Wagner with 14.7 points per game and nearly two steals per game. He also comes in seventh on the program's single season three-point list with 66. Wagner was a first team All-IIAC selection and head coach Brian VanHaaften was named Coach of the Year.

The University of St. Thomas is making its ninth appearance in the NCAA Tournament and its fifth since 2000. The Tommies won the Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (MIAC) for the third year in a row to earn the automatic bid. St. Thomas is 12-0 at home this season has a 34-game conference home winning streak. The Tommies are 9-9 in the NCAA Tournament, including 9-4 at home. St. Thomas is 0-1 against NCAA Tournament teams this season.

Earlier this season, St. Thomas defeated Division II power Winona State 83-82 in overtime down in Winona. That has been the only loss all season for the Warriors.

The Tommies are fourth in the nation with a .514 field goal percentage. St. Thomas is led offensively by sophomore guard Joe Scott, who is averaging 16 points per game. Tyler Nicolai is second on the squad averaging 10.4 points per game. Lonnie Robinson, who also plays baseball for the Tommies, has collected seven MIAC Championships during his time at the school.

#### Series History

UW-Stevens Point is 2-0 all-time against the University of Chicago. The Pointers defeated the Maroons in the third round of the NCAA Tournament in 2000 by a score of 63-49. Stevens Point then defeated the Maroons 70-58 at the Midway Classic in Chicago in 2004.

The Pointers have faced Buena Vista just once back in 2005 in the Clarke College Tournament where they defeated the Beavers 75-70.

Stevens Point has also faced St. Thomas just once way back in 1974. The Tommies won that game 74-62.
