Egner is in her second year as chair of the NCAA Division III women's basketball tournament selection committee.

Pointers Update:

The 10th-ranked UW-Stevens Point women's basketball team extended its winning streak to eight games this week as it defeated UW-River Falls 83-70 Wednesday night and beat UW-Platteville 78-51 on Saturday.

The Pointers got some revenge on UW-River Falls Wednesday night as they defeated the Falcons 83-70. The Pointers lost all three games to the Falcons last season. The Pointers took the lead for good after a 9-0 run near the end of the first half. River Falls kept within striking distance for the first 12 minutes of the second half, cutting the Pointer lead down to seven on a number of occasions. However, the Pointers put the game out of reach with an 8-0 run with less than six minutes to play.

Haley Houghton scored 15 of her game-high 19 points in the first half. Chelsea Kranz and Britta Petersen also scored in double-figures. Kranz finished with 14 points, while Petersen had a career-high 13 points, 12 of which coming in the second half. Petersen also had a career-high seven rebounds to lead Stevens Point. Katie Webber had a team-high five assists.

The Pointers held the Pioneers to just six field goals in the second half as they defeated UW-Platteville 78-51 Saturday at Berg Gym.

The Pointers went on a 10-0 run with three minutes left in the first half to make the score 29-20. Stevens Point had a 35-26 halftime lead. The Pioneers came out in the second half and made a couple of buckets to cut the lead to four. From there on out it was all Stevens Point. The Pointers went on a 13-0 run, which was sparked by back-to-back Haley Houghton three-pointers. Later in the second half, the Pointers went on a 9-0 run to extend their lead to 32 with less than five minutes remaining.

The Pointer balance continued as only two Pointers scored in double-figures. Haley Houghton had 13 points to lead the Pointers and **Laura Neuenfeldt** had 11 points.

Team Notes:

- * UW-Stevens Point is off to its best start since it started 15-1 in 2003-04. That year the Pointers made it all the way to the NCAA Division III Final Four.
- * The Pointers have won eight straight games. It is the longest streak since the Pointers won 10 straight during the 2004-05 season.
- * UW-Stevens Point is defeating opponents at Berg Gym by an average of 35.6 points per game. The closest margin of victory at home this season for the Pointers was a 13-point win over UW-La Crosse.
- * In Saturday's game Platteville was held to just one field goal over the span of 16 minutes in the second half and had just seven assists against 30 turnovers.
- * UW-Stevens Point leads the conference with a .762 (231-303) free throw percentage. The Pointers also lead in with a .475 (402-847) field goal percentage.
- * The Pointer defense continues to be stellar as they lead the conference in scoring defense (54.9 ppg), field goal percentage defense (.342), and three-point field goal percentage defense (.229).
- * UW-Stevens Point is out-rebounding opponents by an average of seven rebounds per game. The Pointers have had the rebounding edge in 11 of the 14 games this season.

Individual Notes:

- * Senior guard **Haley Houghton** (Wausau/East) has made 27 straight free throws since her last miss in the first half vs. Point Loma (CA). Houghton is ranked second in Division III with a .949 free throw percentage (37-39).
- * Freshman forward **Britta Petersen** (Luck) had back-to-back career games last week with nine points against Oshkosh and then 13 points against River Falls. She also had a career-high seven rebounds vs. River Falls.
- * Senior guard **Megan Pehler** (Oregon) had a season-high six points vs. Platteville on Saturday. Pehler was 2-for-3 on three-point attempts in six minutes of action.
- * Senior forward **Chelsea Kranz** (Columbus) lead the conference shooting 64 % (51-80) from the field this season. Kranz has shot over 50 % in the last four games.

Scouting the Opponents

UW-Stout comes into Wednesday's game riding a seven-game winning streak. In their last contest, the Blue Devils nipped UW-La Crosse 71-70 on Saturday. Julia Hirssig hit a layup at the buzzer to give the Blue Devils the victory. Stout trailed 29-6 in the first half.

Hirssig leads the Blue Devils in scoring this season, averaging 14 points per game. She also gets the majority of the rebounds as she leads the conference with 8.8 rebounds per game. Hirssig is second in the WIAC with a .636 field goal percentage. The Blue Devils as a team are second in the conference with 215 offensive rebounds

UW-Superior is on the opposite end of the spectrum as it has lost its last six games. The last five defeats have been by 15 points or more. In their last game, the Yellowjackets lost by a score of 67-52 to UW-Oshkosh.

The Yellowjackets don't have player that averages in double-figures in scoring. The leading scorer is Carissa Nord, who averages 9.6 points per game. Nord is second in the conference, averaging 1.85 three-pointers per game. Tessa Gronli averages 8.3 points per game. Gigi Hudson leads the team with 69 rebounds.

Series History

The Pointers are 28-25 all-time against UW-Stout. Stevens Point snapped a three-game losing streak to the Blue Devils in the last meeting with a 74-71 victory. Nathalie Lechault made a free throw with 12 seconds led to break the 12th tie of the game and Chelsea Kranz made two free throws after the Blue Devils missed a jumper.

The Pointers dominate the all-time against UW-Superior with a 49-3 record. The Pointers have won 24 straight meetings against the Yellowjackets. The last Superior victory came in 1995 when the Yellowjackets beat the Pointers 77-73 in overtime.
