Pointers Update:

The 10th-ranked Pointers had to rally from a five-point halftime deficit to defeat UW-Stout 85-68 Wednesday night at Berg Gym.

The Blue Devils went on a 9-0 run early in the game and led for the rest of the first half. The Pointers regained the lead after an 8-0 run with 15 minutes left in the game Later in the second half the Pointers went on an 8-1 run and led the rest of the way, growing their lead to 19 at one point.

Haley Houghton led the Pointers with 18 points. Jessi Sporle was right behind her with 15 points. Both Houghton and Sporle each had a team-high six rebounds. Laura Neuenfeldt had 12 points and Janell Van Gomple chipped in with 10 points off the bench.

On Saturday, the Pointers cruised to an 83-38 victory over UW-Superior on Alumni Day at Berg Gym.

The Pointers broke open a seven-point game in the first half by outscoring the Yellowjackets 20-3 the final eight minutes of the first half.

Stevens Point finished with a field goal percentage of .579 for the game, while Superior was held to just 27 % shooting. The Pointers outscored the Yellowjackets 24-6 in the paint and scored 30 points off of turnovers. The Pointer bench finished with 45 points.

Haley Houghton once again led the Pointers in scoring with a game-high 13 points. **Chelsea Kranz** was the only other Stevens Point player to score in double-figures as she had 10 points. **Ali Nicastro** had a team-high five rebounds. Jessi Sporle had a nice all-around game with six points, four rebounds, and five assists.

The Pointers will be in action next on Wednesday night when they go to Eau Claire for a showdown with the conference-leading Blugolds. The tip-off begins at 7 p.m. in Zorn Arena.

Team Notes:

- * UW-Stevens Point is off to its best start since it started 15-1 in 2003-04. That year the Pointers made it all the way to the NCAA Division III Final Four. A win Wednesday would match the start of the 2001-02 season. That year the Pointers won the National Championship.
- * The Pointers have won 10 straight games. It is the longest streak since the Pointers won 10 straight during the 2004-05 season. The longest win streak in team history is 13 in the 1986-87 season.
- * UW-Stevens Point made 10 three-point field goals vs. Superior on Saturday. It was the most three-pointers in a game this season and the most since it had 10 vs. River Falls in the WIAC Tournament last season.
- * The Pointers had their best shooting game of the season Saturday with a .579 field goal percentage. That was the best since they shot 61.3 % vs. MSOE last season.
- * The Pointers shot a season-low eight free throws on Saturday. That followed the 35 free throws the Pointers shot on Wednesday vs. Stout. The 35 free throws was the second-most this season. The teams combined for just 19 free throws Saturday the fewest this season. The Pointers lead the conference with a .766 free throw percentage.
- * UW-Stevens Point leads the WIAC with a + 25.1 scoring margin. The Pointers are defeating opponents at Berg Gym this season by an average of 34.6 points per game.
- * UW-Stevens Point leads the conference with a .478 field goal percentage and holding opponents to just a .340 field goal percentage.

Individual Notes:

- * Freshman guard **Andrea Flease** (New London) had a career-high eight points against Superior on Saturday. Flease was 2-for-3 on three-point attempts. Flease also has 10 steals in the last three games, including five against Stout on Wednesday.
- * Senior guard **Haley Houghton** (Wausau/East) has scored in double-figures in 12 of the 15 games this season. Houghton has led the Pointers in scoring the last five games and seven of the last eight games.
- * Senior guard **Megan Pehler** (Oregon) had a career-high eight points vs. Superior on Saturday. Pehler was 2-for-4 on three-point attempts in 14 minutes of action. Pehler has scored a season-high two of the last three games.
- * Freshman forward **Britta Petersen** (Luck) had nine points in 13 minutes of action against the Yellowjackets on Saturday. Petersen was 4-for-5 from the field, including her first three-pointer of her collegiate career.

Scouting the Opponents

UW-Eau Claire is undefeated in conference action this season with a record of 7-0. The Blugolds have won four straight games, including a 63-60 upset of then second-ranked UW-Whitewater. Two of the three losses this season by Eau Claire came in the Surf n' Slam Classic, the same tournament the Pointers won. The Blugolds are coming off a 79-60 victory over UW-River Falls on Saturday.

The Blugolds are second in the conference, holding opponents to just 55.8 points per game. Teams are shooting just 36.1 % vs. the Blugolds.

Heidi Arciszewski and Michelle Burns lead the Blugolds in scoring, both averaging 13 points per game. Burns also leads the team with 95 rebounds. Heather Witt is also averaging in double-figures in scoring with 10.2 points per game. Witt is shooting 49 % (24-49) from beyond the three-point line. Witt also leads the conference with 59 assists.

UW-Oshkosh has a 7-10 overall record and has lost four of the last five games, including the last two. The Titans are coming off a 60-40 defeat to UW-La Crosse on Saturday.

Whitney Tyriver is only Titan averaging in double-figures in scoring with 14.2 points per game. She also has a team-high 6.2 rebounds per game.

Tyriver and Erin Baganz lead the conference in minutes played both averaging over 31 minutes per game.

Series History

The Pointers are 41-34 all-time against UW-Eau Claire. The Pointers have won three of the last four, but dropped the last meeting at Eau Claire 60-51. The home team has won the last 10 games in the series.

UW-Stevens Point is 36-46 all-time against UW-Oshkosh. The Pointers defeated the Titans earlier this season by a score of 79-47 at Berg Gym. Haley Houghton led the way with 14 points. The Pointers have won the last five against the Titans.
