She enters the 2007-08 season ranked second on the all-time WIAC victories list and 41st among active NCAA Division III coaches. Egner is in her second year as chair of the NCAA Division III women's basketball tournament selection committee.

Pointers Update:

The 11th-ranked UW-Stevens Point women's basketball team used a 21-0 run from the end of the first half to the beginning of the second half to down UW-Oshkosh 79-47 Saturday at Berg Gym.

Stevens Point led throughout as **Laura Neuenfeldt** began the game with a three-pointer. The Pointers went up 5-0 after a pair of **Haley Houghton** free throws. With the score 11-8 with 14 minutes left in the half, the Pointers went on a 6-0 run to extend their lead back to nine with 11:38 on the clock. Stevens Point then went on a 7-0 run to make the score 26-12 with seven minutes left.

With the score 28-18 with 4:21 remaining in the first half, the Pointers scored the final 11 points of the first half to make the halftime score 39-18. Houghton had eight straight points during that span.

The Pointers then came out in the second half and scored the first 10 points to conclude a 21-0 run and make the score 49-18 with over 17 minutes left. Stevens Point extended its lead to as much as 37 with nine minutes left and cruised to a 79-47 victory.

The Pointers shot a season-high 54 % from the field, including 7-of-16 from beyond the arc. Stevens Point finished an efficient 16-of-19 from the free throw line. The Pointer bench outscored the Titan bench 42-8.

The Pointers once again showed a lot of balance as they only had two players score in double figures and 13 different players score. Haley Houghton led the way with 14 points, while **Chelsea Kranz** had to 10 points. **Ashley Baker** had a season-high six rebounds to lead the Pointers.

Team Notes:

- * UW-Stevens Point is off to its best start since it started 15-1 in 2003-04. That year the Pointers made it all the way to the NCAA Division III Final Four.
- * The 32-point win over UW-Oshkosh is the largest over a conference opponent since the Pointers defeated UW-Superior by 36 points last season. The Pointers have defeated their past three opponents by an average of 27 points per game.
- * Opponents are just 13-for-74 on three-point attempts in the last four games. Teams are shooting just 23 % from beyond the arc for the season. That is the best in the conference.
- * UW-Stevens Point is the best free throw shooting team in the WIAC. The Pointers are 196-for-257 (.763) from the charity stripe.
- * The Pointers lead the conference in most of the major defensive categories. They are first in scoring defense (53.9 ppg.), field goal percentage defense (.343), and defensive rebounds (27.33 rpg.). They are outrebounding opponents by a conference best 8.6 rebounds.
- * The Pointers shot a season-high 54 % vs. Oshkosh on Saturday. It was the best shooting performance since they shot 57 % vs. UW-Platteville at the end of last season.

Individual Notes:

- * Junior forward **Ashley Baker** (Pittsville) had a season-high eight points and six rebounds vs. Oshkosh on Saturday. Baker was 3-for-4 from the field and 2-for-3 from the free throw line in 12 minutes of action. Baker's career-high is nine points.
- * Freshman forward **Britta Petersen** (Luck) scored a career-high nine points on Saturday. Petersen was 4-for-5 from the field and 1-for-2 from the free throw line in 16 minutes of action.
- * Senior forward **Chelsea Kranz** (Columbus) has scored in double-figures in the last two games. Kranz was a perfect 4-for-4 from the free throw line and 3-for-4 from the field.
- * Sophomore center Camille Brueggen (Viroqua) scored a season-high four points vs. Oshkosh.

Scouting the Opponents

UW-River Falls is coming off an 86-54 defeat to UW-Whitewater on Saturday. The Falcons are 4-2 at home this season, but are 0-2 in conference home games.

Caitlin Hunstock leads River Falls scoring 13 points per game. She also has a team-high 5.8 rebounds per game.

The Pioneers had a four-game winning streak snapped Saturday with a 80-68 loss at UW-Stout. The Pioneers started the season 1-3, but have won seven of the last nine games.

The Pioneers are second in the conference with 198 offensive rebounds. They are also second with a + 5.69 turnover margin. Platteville leads the WIAC with 87 three-point field goals. Vanessa Nemitz has made the most three-point field goals in the conference with 27.

Lisa Wubben leads the Pioneers in scoring averaging 14.5 points per game. She also has a team-high 92 rebounds and in assists with 43. Lisa Grantman is the only other Pioneer averaging in double-figures as she is scoring 11.5 points per game. Grantman leads the conference with 38 steals.

Series History

UW-Stevens Point is 41-22 all-time against UW-River Falls. The Falcons have had the Pointers' number lately winning the last three meetings and five of the last seven. The Falcons eliminated the Pointers out of the WIAC Tournament last season, winning by a score of 76-69 at Berg Gym.

The Pointers are 41-12 against UW-Platteville all-time. Stevens Point has won eight straight against the Pioneers. The last time the Pioneers defeated Stevens Point ay Berg Gym was February 2, 2002.
